September is the kick-off of the Marian Hour of Prayer Traveling Icon Program. There is a new icon of Our Lady of Guadalupe. However, this icon was supplied by Supreme Council, blessed by Pope Benedict, and has a patch of dirt from Mount Tepeyak, where Our Lady appeared. Most importantly, the icon has been touched by the Tilma, making the icon a 3rd order relic. Director James Martin has laid out the path through Districts 7, 10, 14, 8, 6, 4, to 5 before the State Convention. The traveling Icon of Our Lady of Guadalupe will be traveling to each council for a week duration.

On September 17, we will have a 3rd Degree in Florence; and on September 24, we will have a 3rd Degree in Taylors. Also on September 17, the State Council and all the Council Pro-Life Chairmen will be attending the Diocese of Charleston Respect Life Conference in Columbia. And on September 23, we will attend the dedication of the 6th ultrasound machine at Daybreak Pregnancy Center in Lexington. Get active. Put your Catholic Faith into action.

This year we have added three Regional Meetings to better inform your council's officers. They will be held at Council 724 in Columbia on Sunday afternoon, September 25, at Hanahan-Goose Creek Council 6726 on Sunday afternoon, October 2, and at Council 1668 in Greenville on Saturday, October 22. Christopher Kerzich, a Seminarian at Mundelein Seminary in Chicago, and former National Youth President of the Boy Scouts writes about his experience as an Eagle Scout. Read about how Chris' involvement in the organization influenced his decision to pursue the priesthood.

There are many factors that affect the increase in vocations in the US, but a significant percentage of the men ordained priests today are the fruit of one American institution, the Boy Scouts of America.

According to the Survey of Ordinands to the Priesthood, participation in the Boy Scouts of America by those men ordained priests has been a consistent phenomenon over the five years. Among the priests ordained in 2011, 30% or “three in ten participated in the Boy Scouts or were Eagle Scouts.” From my experience there seems to be three reasons for these men seeking to serve Holy Mother Church as a priest.

First, the Scouting program develops youth leaders through the ethos of “Doing a Good Turn Daily,” and in doing so, its participants become servant leaders. A Scout is instilled with the habit of serving others which eventually becomes a key aspect of his life. Therefore, from the Scouting ethos of service one can see a young man would naturally be attracted to the servant leadership embodied in the priestly vocation. Second, scouts embrace the connection between an internal reality being developed by external sign. Boy Scouts wear a uniform (external sign) and in doing so bear the responsibility of being called to a higher standard of conduct and stronger character (internal reality). This reality becomes ingrained in the Scout, so much so that it eventually exists with and without the uniform. Since a similar reality exists in the Catholic priest, it is logical that a scout would be drawn to this ministry. Third, the twelfth point of the Scout Law calls a scout to be “reverent toward God.” The program not only calls one to be a man of character but also “faithful to his religious duties.” Scouts are encouraged to dive into their faith communities and are supported by national religious committees. For Catholics, this is the National Catholic Committee on Scouting which encourages Catholic Scouts to learn more about the faith through a variety of programs. Therefore, one's faith can be significantly developed by involvement in the Scouting program.

In the final analysis, one can see that the Catholic Church benefits greatly from the alumni of the Boy Scouts of America. Therefore, one should look to those young men involved in Boy Scouting today and encourage them to explore the possibility of becoming Priests of Jesus Christ. This could be one way to sustain the current rise in men training to become priests.

Knights of Columbus are active. And it will give a lasting expression of his desire to foster unity and solidarity among all the people of our hemisphere.

With this initiative, we will also establish a new museum to celebrate the 500-year Catholic heritage of North America. This shrine will be a place where English-, Spanish- and French-speaking pilgrims from throughout North America will encounter the mission and legacy of one of history's greatest popes. It will be a place where they will continue to experience his blessing and a place where our children and grandchildren will learn about their great heritage as Catholics.

To this end, we will purchase the Pope John Paul II Cultural Center in Washington, D.C., located just down the street from three other institutions that the Knights of Columbus has long supported: the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, The Catholic University of America and the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. I hope the new Shrine of Blessed John Paul II will have a special relationship with each of these institutions and also with the new John Paul II Center presently under construction in Krakow, Poland.

True to Blessed John Paul's vision, and using the story of his life as an inspiration, the shrine will be an opportunity to evangelize and spread the Good News of the Gospel. In a recent letter, Cardinal Tarcisio Bertone, the Vatican secretary of state, expressed his support for our initiative, saying, "I offer heartfelt good wishes for its successful realization. I am particularly appreciative of the desire of the Knights not only to cultivate devotion to the late pontiff, but also to advance his insightful teaching on the complex and fruitful interplay of faith and culture in the New World. I am deeply gratified that your Order has wished to carry forward that vision as part of your commitment to the new evangelization."

Pope John Paul II visited the United States seven different times. He visited Mexico five times, Canada three times and the Philippines twice. Included in his trips was his participation at World Youth Days 18 years ago in Denver and nine years ago in Toronto. His first international trip as pope was to this continent as well — to Mexico City to visit America's mother, Our Lady of Guadalupe.

Because of his tireless evangelization, an entire generation of Catholics has become known as the "John Paul II Generation," and certainly we are honored to continue to spread his powerful message of hope for our country, our continent and our world with the same energy and devotion that is the hallmark of the Knights of Columbus.

The 47<sup>th</sup> Council in South Carolina was Our Lady of Lakes Council 11471, Moncks Corner, and SC

Named for: Lake Area

Chartered date: December 31, 1994

Charter Grand Knight: Charrles E. Spigelmire

In early 1994 Brother Knights who resided in the Bonaue/Moncks Corner and were member's of councils in the now district 13 held a meeting. This meeting was to discuss the feasibility of forming a new council in the brother's local residential area and form a steering committee to research the procedures, rules and regulations for forming a new council. During the spring and summer of 1994, data, information on transfers or new applications were collected. The name our Lady of the Lakes was selected due to the proximity to the Santee Lakes. Then in the fall of 1994 the application package was submitted to the Supreme Council for review.

During the ensuing years of activity, our Council earned numerous Knights of Columbus Star Council awards. The Brothers have routinely support the activities of Charity, Unity and Fraternalism. In addition in the aforementioned the Brothers of Council 11471 have extended their charitable activities to church and community projects. Over the years the brothers have collaborated to assist the Habitat for Humanity programs and constructed numerous handicap ramps to facilitate wheelchair access to the homes of community members who could not afford the expense of having one built. The council provided funds and manpower to accomplish these projects. Council also supported Special Olympics during all games in their area, with food and manpower to run the games. Council also maintains their church grounds and areas. They also provide charitable support to the community which are too numerous to mention. Since 1995 we have met our goals for Operation Hope every year.
